It's all part of a new event created to raise funds for two local causes—the DARE (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) program and the *I Choose RVH* campaign.

Constable Tina Hunt was inspired to organize the Superhero Fun Day after taking her own five-year-old son to a similar event in Ottawa.

She got to work recruiting friends, family and co-workers to help plan a memorable day for superhero fans.

A month prior to the event she has hit her goal of selling 150 tickets. There are a few remaining tickets available for pick up at the OPP detachment on Raglan Street.

"I think I may be more excited than the kids," she says about the festivities planned for the day.

There will be a Superhero Boot Camp with Captain America, Pizza with Michelangelo, Jedi Training, Bonell's Tae Kwon Do School, Youth Yoga with Aimee, Superhero ID cards and a photo booth.

Hunt also teaches the local DARE program through the detachment. Proceeds of the event will help to purchase something little that relates to the program to hand out to students during presentations, as there is no budget for 'extras'.

The event will run from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the RCAF Wing. Tickets are \$20 each and include entrance for one child and one adult, plus lunch and a photo along with all of the special activities.

She is very grateful to Karras Way for sponsoring the pizza and for donations from other organizations. Sport Renfrew has purchased 20 tickets to provide an opportunity for families who may not be able to afford the event.

"All of the money raised will stay right here in the community, which is really important. DARE and *I Choose RVH* are great programs and I am happy to support both causes," she adds.

"We are pleased to be a recipient of this event and what an exciting way to raise awareness on important issues," says Barb Desilets, RVH Foundation Executive Director. She adds, "As RVH undergoes the largest redevelopment in its history, patients and families will benefit for years to come.
